## WDA World Rankings

World Ranking points are awarded to member nations based purely on their final position at recognised international tournaments. These events include, World Cup qualifiers, the World Cup and World Invitational.

Each category (men's, women's and mixed) will have their own rankings system.

The WDA World Rankings system is similar in vein to the World Baseball Softball Confederation (WBSC), whereby points are based on tournament rankings, as opposed to other international sports ranking systems such as the ICC Test Championship for cricket, that is based on both individual matches and the results of series, or the FIFA World Rankings for football, that is based solely on individual matches.

National team rankings are built on a eight-year performance. Following the eight-year cycle, the new year of results will override the first year of the cycle, to be included in the rankings system. Meaning, only results within the four-year bracket will be included in the points system.

## WDA World Ranking Points Formula

World Cup (Men, Women, Mixed): 1<sup>st</sup> – 240 points 2<sup>nd</sup> – 220 points Last Place – 120 points

World Cup Qualifiers (Men, Women, Mixed):

1<sup>st</sup> – 120 points 2<sup>nd</sup> – 110 points Last Place – 20 points

World Invitational (Men, Women, Mixed):

1<sup>st</sup> – 110 points 2<sup>nd</sup> – 100 points Last Place – 10 points

The points awarded after 2<sup>rd</sup> place are spread evenly, in an attempt to ensure balance between international tournaments with different-sized fields.

For instance, finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> out of 10 teams is considered to be a higher accomplishment than finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> out of 6 teams. Given that points are not fixed beyond 2<sup>nd</sup> place, a calculation is used to determine how many points are awarded for each position. The calculation gives the difference between any two consecutive positions from 2<sup>nd</sup> through to last.

**FORMULA** | Number of Points for  $2^{nd} - (Point Difference from <math>2^{nd}$  to last x Places the team finished after  $2^{nd}$ ) Places from  $2^{nd}$  to last at event

**EXAMPLE 1** | Hong Kong (Men's) placed 3 out of 4 teams in the 2015 Asian Championships.

Formula | 110 – (<u>90</u> x 1) (2)

110 – (45 x 1)

Hong Kong receives 65 points.

**EXAMPLE 2** | Northern Ireland (Men's) placed 3 out of 12 teams in the 2015 European Championships.

Formula | 110 – (<u>90</u> x 1) (10)

110 – (9 x 1)

Northern Ireland receives 101 points.

As illustrated in the two examples, Northern Ireland earned a higher point rating of 92, in contrast to Hong Kong's 60, due to a larger number of teams competing at the Euro's (12 teams at the Euro's, compared to 4 teams in the Asian Championships).
